Both original churches were established nearly 150 years ago and combined in 1969.

The church and its members actively support programs for people experiencing housing insecurity (Family Promise, Habitat for Humanity, and Sojourner's Alliance), food insecurity (local food banks), and the college interdenominational campus ministry (The Center at the University of Idaho).

About the Community

Moscow, Idaho is a delightful university city located in the Palouse Prairie foothills of the Northern Rocky Mountains and along the border with Washington state. It is home to more than 26,000 residents. The city of Moscow is known as the "Heart of the Arts", hosting annual events such as The Lionel Hampton International Jazz Festival, Festival Dance, Renaissance Fair, Rendezvous in the Park, and ArtWalk. The historic church is located in the vibrant downtown area with locally owned shops, boutiques, restaurants, and an award-winning Saturday farmers market. The community and United Church of Moscow congregation includes members from the adjacent Pullman, WA with Washington State University community of an additional 32,000 residents located 8 miles to the west. Moscow provides access to a beautiful region grading from open grasslands on the Palouse Prairie to forested mountains to the east, bisected by major rivers (Snake, Clearwater and Salmon rivers), nearby lakes (Coeur d'Alene, Chatcolet and Pen d'Oreille), enormous national forests and the largest wilderness area in the lower 48 states (River of No Return). Spokane, WA with big-city shopping, renowned opera and symphony, regularly visited by the largest theatre and performance groups is a short 1.5-hr drive to the north.
